All you need to do is to get into a group of 4 - 7 people (eg. friends, club members), find a project you'd all like to work on and get creative!

This could be a craft or gardening project, a book of poetry, reflections on village life through the years, a musical composition - the list of what people are passionate about is endless!

To enter the competition, you will need to present your project for judging at the Summer Show. You might be able to bring what you've made or perhaps the produce from a new garden bed or photographs of the development of your project, with an explanation of who took part and how you 'Made it Together' to give the judges a real understanding of your group's endeavours.

There are three age groups for the competition:

8 and under 9 - 14 years 15 and above (including adults!)

Notification of entry must be sent to the Show Secretary (CHS_ShowSec@btinternet.com or by hand to 37, The Street, Capel) by Weds. 12th August 2026, giving the group and participants' names. Entries then need to be brought to the Show Marquee before 10am on Saturday 15th August 2026.

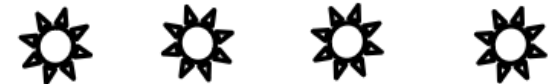

Exhibiting

To exhibit at the Spring Show, you must be a current member of the Society. Membership is renewed each year and expires on 31 December.

Membership fee: Adults, £5; Joint (2 adults at same address), £8; Children 15 and under, free.

Membership cards will be issued, which, on production, will entitle free entry to the Spring Show (£1 for non-members) and other benefits.

You can join the Society when you collect your exhibit card(s) and stage your exhibits between 8.45am and 10.15am on the morning of the Show. Exhibiting entries is free for members.

You may only enter one exhibit per class.

Children's Classes

On exhibiting, please check that the child's age is written on both sides of the exhibit card.

Only one entry per child per class.

Whilst we understand adults' enthusiasm to encourage young entrants, please remember that the entry should be mostly the work of the named entrant!

Children of 5 years and under

- 60 A decorated egg, theme: "Nursery Rhyme Character" (hard-boiled first).
- 61 A Birthday or Easter card, no larger than 30cm x 21cm.
- 62 A Spring Garden on a plate.
- 63 A decorated hat, cap or bonnet for a Spring parade.
- 64 A decorated pebble.
- 65 A plate of 5 decorated small cakes – think Springtime! (Cling filmed.)
- 66 A drawing or painting; "Spring Time", of any size.

Children of 6 to 12 years

- 70 5 decorated biscuits (covered in cling film).
- 71 A pop-up Birthday or Easter card, no larger than 30cm x 21cm.
- 72 A Spring Garden on a plate.
- 73 A decorated pebble.
- 74 Five home-made paper flowers (many ideas on the internet if needed!).
- 75 A plate of 5 decorated small cakes – think Springtime! (Cling filmed.)
- 76 A drawing or painting; "My Springtime Garden", of any size.

Photographs

- 80 A Photograph taken by a child, 12 years and under - any size/subject.

Chocolate treat for all children who enter!

Homecraft

(Remember, only one entry per person per class.)

Cookery

Note – jars & lids must not be branded, except with jar maker's name. 1lb = 454g

- 40 1 Jar of **Marmalade**, 400g or more; label with day/month/year of production.
- 41 1 Jar of **Chutney** (at least 3 months old), 400g or more; label as above.
- 42 1 Jar **Pickled Onions**, 400g or more; label with day/mth/year of production.
- 43 1 Jar of **Honey**, 200g or more; label with day/month/year of production.

All following items to be covered with cling film or similar cover.
Bread - make the previous day; don't freeze overnight or use packet mixes.

- 44 **5 Easter biscuits:** use this recipe: 85g butter, 85g sugar, 1 egg yolk, 170g flour, pinch of salt, 30g currants, 15g chopped peel, ½ tsp mixed spice, little milk if necessary. (Use a fluted cutter. Sprinkle with caster sugar once baked.)
- 45 **A traditional Easter bake from anywhere around the world** eg Simnel cake from the UK, Colomba di pasqua from Italy. (With list of ingredients.)
- 46 **A Decorated Victoria sandwich, theme "Spring"** (top decorated only).
Judged on decoration only.
- 47 5 pieces of **Traybake:** any base mixture of cake/biscuit/cereal with a topping, baked on a tray, cut into squares or fingers to serve. (With list of ingredients.)
- 48 **1 Loaf of White or Wholemeal bread, not made** in a bread-making machine.
- 49 **1 Loaf of Specialist Bread** (e.g. fruit/olive etc.), **not made** in a bread-making machine. (With list of ingredients.)
- 50 **1 Loaf** of any type **made** in a bread-making machine. (With list of ingredients.)
- 51 **6 eggs** – condition of shell and contents of the egg will be judged.

Handicrafts "Over the Winter" (Remember, only one entry per class.)

Items produced in those cold, dark days when you couldn't garden, walk etc.

- 52 **Item of Handicraft.** Must fit/stand within a 40cm x 40cm square. **(Special prize)**
- 53 **Painting** in any medium, any subject. **New in 2025.**

Classes for 13-15 year olds - New in 2025

- 90 **Horticultural** – an exhibit from any of the adult classes.
- 91 **Cookery** – an exhibit from any of the adult classes.
- 92 **Handicraft** – an exhibit from either of the adult classes. **(Chilvers prize)**

How to enter the C.H.S. Spring Show:

1. Look at the Show schedule – available online at **capelhorticulturalsociety.org.uk** and from local shops.
2. Decide which classes you would like to enter (only one entry per class).
3. Prepare your entries.
4. Bring your entries to Capel Village Hall on the morning of the Show between 8.45am and 10.15am.
5. Here you will pay your membership fee if you haven't already done so, and be given an entry card for each of your entries (you will need to know the numbers of the classes you are entering).
6. You then take each entry with its card, and place it in the correct class on one of the tables in the hall.
7. All the entries will be judged before the Show opens at 2pm, when you can return and see how you've done – 1st, 2nd and 3rd stickers on entry cards will show who has won prizes.
8. If you have won a prize, this can be collected from the treasurer.
9. There are trophies awarded at the Show – details can be found in the schedule. These are presented at about 3.30pm.
10. You can then collect your entries and entry cards to take home, unless you have decided to donate any of them to the auction for Society funds.
11. Start thinking about what you'd like to enter in the Summer show!

We hope that entering the C.H.S. Shows is, first and foremost, fun. However, please read all the introductory notes and class descriptions carefully – don't be daunted by them; they are there so that the competition is fair for all and maintains our high standards. When it comes to the judging of entries, the judges are very knowledgeable in their particular field and any comments from them should be seen as a learning experience rather than criticism!

Helpful Hints: The RHS Classification of Narcissi Divisions will be used. Measure length of trumpet and petals if you are in doubt of class to enter and refer to RHS Show Handbook and any provided illustrations. Narcissi (Daffodils) may be staged with their leaves; e.g. 3 leaves with 3 flowers. A **Vase's** height is taller than its width, while a **Bowl's** width is equal to or wider than its height.

Horticultural Classes

Cut Flowers (Remember, only one entry per person per class.)

- 1 A vase of **3 Trumpet narcissi** (Div. 1) of one variety (no miniatures); *length of trumpet as long as or longer than length of petal.*
- 2 A vase of **3 Large cupped narcissi** (Div. 2) of one variety (no miniatures); *length of cup more than one third but less than equal to length of petal.*
- 3 A vase of **3 Short cupped narcissi** (may be Div. 3 or Div. 9 (e.g. Old Pheasant Eye)) of one variety (no miniatures); *length of cup less than one-third length of petal.*
- 4 A vase of **3 Double narcissi** (single headed only) of one variety.
- 5 A vase of **3 Multi-headed narcissi** of one variety; no dwarfs or miniatures.
- 6 **'Any Other'**. A vase of 3 narcissi, of one variety, not included in the above classes eg split corona.
- 7 A vase of **3 Dwarf or Miniature narcissi** of one variety, to include narcissi of less than 12" high, may be single or multi-headed.
- 8 A vase or bowl of **9 Narcissi** of two or more varieties. (Hall prize)
- 9 A vase of **3 Tulips** of one variety.
- 10 A vase of **5 Tulips** of two or more varieties.
- 11 A vase or bowl of **Spring flowers** (these include Wallflowers, Pansies, Auriculas, etc., but exclude narcissi and tulips; exhibit 10 stems at least, of one or more kinds or varieties; natural foliage allowed).
- 12 A vase or bowl of **Primulas** of 2 or more mixed varieties (no more than 6 stems); *Primulas include primroses and polyanthus.*
- 13 **4 Pansy blooms**, including violas, of one or more varieties. Container supplied.
- 14 A vase with **1 Camellia bloom**, natural foliage allowed.
- 15 A vase with **3 Camellia blooms** of one or more varieties, natural foliage allowed.
- 16 A vase of **3 flowering Shrub/Tree stems**, one or more kinds.

Pot Plants & Vegetables (Remember, only one entry per person per class.)

- 17 **1 Flowering plant** in pot (max 19cm (7") diameter) (corms, e.g. cyclamen; pseudobulbs, e.g. orchids; and rhizomes, e.g. begonias, allowed but **not** bulbs).
- 18 **1 Flowering plant** in pot (over 19cm (7") diameter) (corms, pseudobulbs and rhizomes, allowed but **not** bulbs).
- 19 **1 Foliage plant** in pot of any size.
- 20 **1 Pot of Flowering bulb(s)** (max 39cm (15") diameter) (corms, pseudobulbs and rhizomes **not** allowed). (Hall prize)
- 21 **1 Cactus or Succulent** in pot (max 13cm (5") diameter).
- 22 **1 Cactus or Succulent** in pot (over 13cm (5") diameter).
- 23 A pot, trough or bowl of **Alpine plants** of any size.
- 24 **A large tray of pricked-out seedlings** (approx. 37cm x 23cm) of one kind, labelled with name and date of sowing. (Hall prize)
- 25 Best **Tomato plant** judged on health and vigour; one prize only given.
- 26 3 sticks of **Rhubarb** with scales removed but the bottom 8cm (3") of leaf left on.
- 27 3 **Leeks**, washed but not trimmed.
- 28 **2 or more** of any kind of **Vegetable**.

Decorative – Floral Exhibits

No artificial flowers to be used. Use of oasis to be avoided if possible.

- 29 **"Colours of Spring"**, an exhibit, not exceeding 60cm width and depth, accessories allowed.
- 30 **"Little Gems"**, a petite exhibit not exceeding 25cm in width, depth or height, accessories allowed.

Photographs

(Remember, only one entry per person per class.)

- 81 **A Colour photograph** – any size and subject.
- 82 **A Photograph taken in the Parish of Capel** – any size and subject.
- 83 **A Winter or Spring Scene** – any size and subject.
- 84 **A Photograph where the main focus is a person** – any size.
